### **Convention Dress Code**

**Casual:** Includes comfortable, appropriate clothing that excludes plummeting necklines, midriff exposure, and clothing that is too short. Long pants and closed-toe shoes or boots will be required for tours. It may be cold during convention, so please bring winter attire for the tours.

**Business Casual:** Nicer than jeans but not as nice as business professional clothing. This could include khakis and a nice shirt or sweater and nice shoes or boots.

**Business Professional:** Implies something you would feel comfortable wearing to a job interview. Men should wear blazers with a tie and women should wear slacks or a skirt. No jeans should be worn to business professional events (Banquet Attire).

*Name tags should be worn at all times during Convention*
